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Demographic Profile

The population in Clinton County, Ohio was 42,046 per American Community Survey data for 2017-2021.

The region has a civilian labor force of 20,953 with a participation rate of 62.8%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Clinton County, Ohio, 20.9% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 35.1% in the nation.

The median household income in Clinton County, Ohio is \$57,409 and the median house value is \$149,500.



Employment Trends


As of 2023Q1, total employment for Clinton County, Ohio was 19,978 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2023Q1, employment increased 1.4% in the region.

Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Clinton County, Ohio was 3.9% as of July 2023. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 3.8%. One year earlier, in July 2022, the unemployment rate in Clinton County, Ohio was 4.6%.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Clinton County, Ohio earned annual wages of \$57,902 as of 2023Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 4.0% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$68,501 in the nation as of 2023Q1.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2022Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q1.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 5.3% lower in Clinton County, Ohio than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Clinton County, Ohio is Transportation and Warehousing, employing 4,610 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Manufacturing (3,172 workers) and Retail Trade (1,651). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Transportation and Warehousing (LQ = 4.66), Manufacturing (1.96), and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (1.80).

Sectors in Clinton County, Ohio with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$135,723), Utilities (\$89,795), and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$80,302). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Transportation and Warehousing (+1,144 jobs), Construction (+234), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+204).

Over the next 1 year, employment in Clinton County, Ohio is projected to expand by 33 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction with a +2.1% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+15 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+12), and Transportation and Warehousing (+11).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Clinton County, Ohio is Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, employing 3,873 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Office and Administrative Support Occupations (2,263 workers) and Production Occupations (2,208). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (LQ = 2.22), Production Occupations (1.96), and Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations (1.51).

Occupation groups in Clinton County, Ohio with the highest average wages per worker are Legal Occupations (\$103,200), Management Occupations (\$102,000), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$95,900). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.4% among Legal Occupations to 6.7% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Clinton County, Ohio is expected to be Personal Care and Service Occupations with a +1.6% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+13 jobs) and Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (+12). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Transportation and Material Moving Occupations (506 jobs) and Office and Administrative Support Occupations (268).



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Clinton County, Ohio with the highest relative concentration is Freight Tran. with a location quotient of 6.40. This cluster employs 3,614 workers in the region with an average wage of \$67,863. Employment in the Freight Tran. cluster is projected to expand in the region about 0.2% per year over the next ten years.




Location quotient and average wage data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, imputed where necessary, and updated through 2022Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2023Q1. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Clinton County, Ohio is projected to grow 0.2% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.5% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.4% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.7% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Education Levels


Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2022, nominal GDP in Clinton County, Ohio expanded 5.2%. This follows growth of 14.6% in 2021. As of 2022, total GDP in Clinton County, Ohio was \$2,507,647,000.



Gross Domestic Product data are provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, imputed by Chmura where necessary, updated through 2022.

Of the sectors in Clinton County, Ohio, Transportation and Warehousing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2022, \$625,921,000 The next-largest contributions came from Manufacturing (\$512,673,000); Wholesale Trade (\$153,300,000); and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$138,103,000).

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
